This summer we are extending our reach in the world! We are offering THREE unique experiences – in Costa Rica, Georgia, and Uganda. We understand there are many motivations behind why you may be applying (friends, adventure, service hours, desire to grow deeper with God, wanting to serve significantly) and the list could go on!

***These trips are first and most importantly about what God is doing in our world and how we can join that and support ministry partners in Costa Rica, Uganda and Georgia.***

**Trip Description:**

This summer we will be continuing our partnership with 6:8 Ministries to serve the people of Costa Rica in two locations. This team of students will be led by Brandon Gober and adults who are leaders in our High School ministry (full list of leaders will be shared at the Feb. 18 parent meeting).

Our team will spend most of the week at the Living Water Ranch. At the ranch, our team will take part in multiple service projects in the community. We will also continue to support the relationships 6:8 has started with the surrounding community. Our team will also spend a day in Alajuelita, the poorest county in all of Costa Rica. The unemployment rate in Alajuelita is a staggering 70%. Here we will be participating in ministry projects such as prayer walks, kid ministry, feeding centers, and more. We hope students will experience God and Christian community, expand their view of the world and what God is doing in it, and see how the Christian life is a life of following Jesus and serving others.

**Who should Apply:**

- High School students who have prayed about this trip and feel God leading them to this team.
- Students who are willing to set aside their personal comforts and fully participate in all aspects of the week. This trip includes physically challenging work, relational connection, community engagement, and spiritual growth.
- Students who will have a great attitude at all times and who will be open to what God is doing.

**\*Note:** Students on this trip will only be allowed to bring cell phones for use on travel days. Phones will be locked in a safe during the week and MPC is not responsible for lost, damaged, or stolen phones. Parents will have emergency numbers, and we will post daily updates on a private Facebook page.

**Dates And Requirements:**

A trip of this size and cost is no small undertaking! For everything to run smoothly and be fully funded we need the following from team members and their families – (these are NOT optional):

Team Members:

- ❖ **Complete application** and turn in a \$300 non-refundable deposit by Monday, January 29!

(Anyone not selected for this year's team or put on waitlist will have their total deposit refunded)

- ❖ **Attend Parent/Student Meeting:** February 18, 4-6pm at the Mandarin Road Campus  
\*\*\*Save this date\*\*\*
- ❖ **Current passport** (expiration cannot be less than 6 months after the trip)
- ❖ **Help sell mulch** to family and friends and distribute flyers in neighborhoods - we are asking each participant to have a goal of at least 10 orders from family/neighbors outside of the church
- ❖ **Help with spreading mulch** on 4 of these 6 dates: March 16, 23, 30 and April 6, 13, 20.  
\*If you do not complete 4 spread days, \$150 will be added to your balance for each missed day. You can have a parent or another person work for you if needed.
  - **Mulch days are from 8am – 5pm. Students are responsible for being there the entire time OR getting someone to come fill in their spot if they have to leave early/arrive late.**
  - **At least one of your four days needs to be April 13 or 20 as these are our two biggest weeks!**
- ❖ **Pay remaining deposits:** \$225 by March 6, \$225 by April 6, and \$225 by May 19
- ❖ **Participate in Crave or Wed. Bible Study *at least twice a month.*** (It is important to be connected with peers and growing in faith year round – not just in Costa Rica!)
- ❖ **Attend Training Days**
  - Training: Sunday, May 19 from 4-6pm
  - Training: Sunday, June 30 from 6-8:30pm
- ❖ **Commissioning Service:** June 30 at the 10:30am Worship Service
- ❖ **Actual Mission Trip:** July 1-7
- ❖ **Team Worship Rehearsal:** Saturday, July 20 from 9am – noon.
- ❖ **Sharing Worship Service: Sunday, July 21 at the 10am Worship Service**

## Parent Requirements

Parents (or an adult in family):

- ❖ **Attend Parent/Student Meeting:** February 18 from 4-6pm at the Mandarin Road Campus
- ❖ Sign up for at least **2 days of the following** (Signup Genius)
  - Selling mulch at the tent on Saturdays on mulch spread dates
  - Mulch Deliveries – Every Thursday and Friday before spread dates (or other day as available)
  - Selling mulch at the table on Sundays – each Sunday counts as ½ a day

- Drive and spread on mulch Saturdays
- ❖ **Make sure your child is available to attend and fulfill all of the listed requirements and that payments are made at the designated times**

\*All applications submitted will be carefully reviewed. Submitting your application DOES NOT guarantee your spot on a team. We will consider a variety of factors for team selection (not limited to but including): **Time and day application is submitted**; involvement at MPC/Crave/Bible Study (see below); maturity and leadership; experience on past trips; small group numbers and thoughtfulness of answers.

\*This trip is open to all HS students who are able to commit to the team requirements. We anticipate this year we could have a waitlist. **Time and day that your application is submitted matters.** Those who have attended 3 or more times between Sep. and Dec. will have increased priority in selection. This does not mean if you come regularly that you are guaranteed a spot.

**Applications will be accepted starting at 10pm on January 8 through midnight on January 29.**

Deposits are due January 29 to hold your application. We will notify everyone of team selection no later than February 5, 2024. We will deposit checks at the time of team announcements.

Anyone not selected for a team or waitlisted will have their deposits returned. **Airfare and many other trip expenses are non-refundable. If it is necessary for you to drop after the team selection, we can only refund what you have paid beyond our expenses to that point.**

## FUNDRAISING

Mulch is the main fundraiser for this trip and is the only way we can offer participants the discounted trip cost. Even if you could pay the trip cost, many others cannot. We couldn't pull it off and assist others without everyone's efforts – that is why it is a requirement. We will be taking orders and then doing all deliveries and spreading over a 6-week window of time. Participants will choose 4 of the 6 spreading Saturdays to work. See dates page for details.

In addition to mulch, team members have the option to sell TPC tickets and keep \$40 per ticket sold for their trip cost. We will also give you a sample letter that can be sent out to family and friends if you would like to raise money that way. \*TPC tickets can be sold immediately – you do not need to wait for team selection.
